Helping the NHS and healthcare systems overseas

Do you have unutilised training capacity in anaesthesia, intensive care or pain medicine within your department and want to develop partnerships with overseas institutions?

The Medical Training Initiative (MTI) scheme allows you to utilise training posts with highly motivated international medical graduates from low and middle income countries who meet the essential eligibility criteria. For a maximum of 24 months, these doctors will make the difference in your department and, upon returning to their home country, they will put into practice their new skills and experience in their own healthcare systems.

Where do I start?

- ✓ Understand the [MTI scheme](#), its aims and your role and responsibilities.
- ✓ Identify MTI posts within your department.
- ✓ Obtain [MTI post approval](#) by applying to the RCoA.
- ✓ Shortlist MTI candidates (you can source your own candidates or the RCoA can provide you with CVs).
- ✓ Confirm appointment.
